Brief Description

Bloomfield High School (BHS) is located in a suburban setting in central Connecticut and houses 535 students in grades 9-12. Bloomfield covers 26.4 miles and has a total population of about 20,000 residents. Bloomfield was designated an All-American city in 1973, recognizing the success Bloomfield has had as an ethnically and culturally diverse community. Major businesses in the area include CIGNA, Kaman Air Craft, Griffin Center Technology Park, and Pepperidge Farms.

Grading System

BHS is on a seven-period schedule with a floating block. The academic year consists of two semesters with two marking periods per semester. BHS grants full-year and semester (half-year) credits. Students are ranked and must receive final grades at BHS for two consecutive semesters to be included in rank. Grades are reported quarterly, and credit is awarded at the end of the year. BHS provides instruction to students via three difficulty levels: AP/UCONN, Honors, and Academic. A quality-point value is assigned to each level. The grade point average is weighted and is determined by multiplying the quality-point value of the grade of each course by its credit value. The quality point matrices are as follows:
